



## Advanced breast cancer with remarkable healing of a big wound

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Quite a few breast cancer patients chooses to say no to an operation and instead through a change of lifestyle and different natural remedies try to make the cancer disappear.

What happens in many of these cases is that the cancer grows and perforates the skin. In the end a big wound appears with foul-smelling secretion.

A Danish woman F.S (born 1944) is such a patient. She discovered in 2001 at 57 years of age, a cyst in her right breast the size of a hazelnut. According to the patient the tumor disappeared within the following year. In February 2008 a wound appeared just above the right nipple. The patient did not suspect that the wound could be cancer related and hence did not seek a doctor.

The wound got bigger and bigger, and she was admitted to the local hospital towards the end of August 2009, with respiratory problems. The right pleura were drained of almost 3 litres of fluid. A biopsy of the big wound, which had grown to 8x8 cm, showed an invasive, ductal breast cancer, estrogen sensitive (estrogen receptor positive).

The patient did not accept the offer of radiation and chemotherapy but accepted treatment with the anti-hormone Femar (an aromatase inhibitor) from the beginning of September 2009.

S.F. arrived at Humlegaarden on 24. September 2009 with a huge wound in the right mamma region and had pronounced respiratory difficulties during activity (functional dyspnoea).

Earlier that summer we had been introduced to a new method of wound healing called WMS – Wireless Micro-current Stimulation. This is a method based on electric stimulation and we thought that this method could be helpful for the patient.

We started the WMS treatment one hour a day and also started her on metronomic chemotherapy using cyclophosphamide 50 mg every other day. We combined this treatment with the mistletoe compound Helixor P in increasing dosage and also with other natural medicaminae for the wound and the fluid.

On the 8th October 2009 we found it necessary to puncture the right pleura again for 1.2 litres of fluid.

Regarding the big wound the patient could already after the first treatments with WMS feel an improvement and the method soon became her preferred treatment among our other local treatments like hyperthermia, rehatron and hyperfoton/magnetic field treatment.

Using standard methods, the prognosis for healing of such a big wound is quite bad, but gradually the wound grew smaller and smaller and by the end of November 2009 after 60 treatments, was completely healed. At the same time the tumormarker CA-15-3 was noticeably reduced. Clinically the patient was markedly better with an increased appetite and weight gain.

The patient decided to stay at Humlegaarden to stabilise her situation and actually stayed until 26. June 2010.

In this period we punctured the pleura 3 times more; on the 12.12.2009, 6.2. and 28.3.2010 for around 0.5 – 1 litre of fluid per time. Since then the patient has experienced no need for puncture.

At our latest contact with the patient on the 9<sup>th</sup> November 2010, she is doing very well, and has resumed her career as an art teacher at art colleges. Currently she receives metronomic chemotherapy with cyclophosphamide 50 mg daily and Helixor P 400 mg every other day. She also continues her treatment with the aromatase inhibitor Aromasin 25 mg daily.

**The patient's own story – written End of October 2009.**

***Success story!***

*In 2009 I found a cyst in my right breast. It came to me that I should be able to heal it away myself. I started right away to*

*visualise a lot of small blue particles inside the cyst, moving around between each other – to dissolve the massive cyst.*

*After 3 months of healing every day there was a small hole inside the cyst where the sick tissue had been healed away.*

*A friend of mine thought it was best if I had the cyst checked – perhaps it was cancer. I went to the hospital for an examination. The surgeon would not even touch my breast, but took a ball pen and drew a triangle on my breast with a dot inside and said “This is where the tumor is”. I told him to palpate the cyst, where the sick tissue was healed away. As I said the word “healed” he turned his eyes towards the ceiling and in this way let me know that I had a very lively imagination. I was then sent for a mammography and seeing the left breast, which is not sick, being flattened out as a pancake – I decided not to let the sick breast getting that “treatment” now when the cyst was almost gone. So I left the hospital.*

*They wrote me several times and told me that I HAD to get the tumor checked. I wrote back that they were very kind in their concern for me, but that I would take full responsibility for myself. Within one year the cyst disappeared.*

*Then during 2007 a small wound appeared just above the nipple on my right breast. I did not believe it to be cancer. It got bigger and bigger. I had the wound examined in August 2009 at the hospital. It was cancer. I declined the conventional therapy with radiation and chemotherapy and instead checked in at Humlegaarden in Humlebæk.*

*Humlegaarden does a test, a cancer marker for breastcancer. It was 372 and within a month it is down to 260. A success story!*

*At Humlegaarden I get mistletoe injections and low dose metronomic cyclophosphamide every other day as well as Femara, which is an anti-estrogen tablet. Additionally I get treated with a lamp that radiates 1.5 Amp. The mistletoe and the cyclophosphamide both help in getting rid of the cancer, and the lamp helps to heal the wound which within four weeks is markedly smaller.*

*I am soon cured – without any operation, without ordinary chemotherapy and radiation. I am very grateful towards Humlegaarden. What I did myself, in this period, was to visualise that new skin was growing over my big open wound. I believe that it is very necessary to participate in the healing process*

*yourself to get well. If I could not have visualised for my inner eye the healing of my wound, I do believe the healing process would have lasted much longer. F.S.*
