



Advanced Non-small Cell Lung Cancer stable on Metronomic Chemotherapy and Mistletoe Treatment

A Danish woman, born 1955, was diagnosed in October 2004 with non-small cell lung cancer (adenocarcinoma), and the upper lobe in the right lung was removed.

The operation however did not remove all tumor tissue, and therefore 30 radiation treatments were given in a dose of 2 Gy per fraction, totally 60 Gy, against the non-radical operated areas. The radiation was ended January 2005.

Well-being until April 2006, where multiple metastases were found in the right lung, biopsy-verified as adenocarcinoma. In addition numerous other metastatic lesions were found.

Thereafter palliative chemotherapy with carboplatin/vinorelbine from the 4th May 2006, totally 4 cycles, and after a CT-scan the patient was told on the 27th July 2006 that the chemotherapy had not caused any reduction in the size or number of the metastatic lesions.

There were lesions in the top of the right lung and in the lower and posterior part of the right lung, stretching out to the pleura. Also lesions in the left lung in the front of hilus and under the pleura as well as in the top of the left lung.

The chemotherapy was stopped.

The patient hereafter stayed in Humlegaarden for three weeks from the 6th September 2006, and she was treated with a tablet sendoxan (cyclophosphamide) 50 mg daily as metronomic chemotherapy (schedule: two weeks on, one week off) and injections of Iscador PchG (a mistletoe compound) in increasing dose.

She was also treated with local hyperthermia a.m. Oncotherm, rehatron immunomodulating low dose naltrexone, the angiogenesis inhibitor Celebrex and other immunestrengthening therapies.

The patient has now followed the treatment with cyclophosphamide, Iscador, Celebrex and LDN at home for more than four years and **her condition late October 2010 is completely stable**, with normal blood tests. **She lives a normal life without symptoms of her illness.** A CT scan in March 2009 showed stable disease with no change. She takes square dance lessons twice a week and walks her two dogs half an hour every day.
