Big Primary Liver cancer

A Norwegian male born in 1921 arrived at Humlegaarden in March 1998 with a newly diagnosed primary liver cancer on the left side of the liver. The tumor was huge: 24 cm (almost 10 inches) in horizontal diameter, 12-14 cm (5 inches) in the vertical diameter, and metastases were present on the right side of the liver.

The patient was not offered any treatment in Norway, and the expected survival time was 1-2 months.

We treated him with local hyperthermia a.m. Oncotherm on the liver and with injections with the mistletoe preparation Helixor A. He was well during the stay and the tumor became visibly smaller.

At home he continued the Helixor A treatment with 100 mg three times per week, and he enjoyed a very good life quality with daily fishing and Sunday trips to the hills of Norway.

Our latest contact with the patient was in June 2004 and he died at the end of April 2005, seven years and two months after his stay at Humlegaarden at age 84.
