Non Hodgkin Lymphoma

A 51-year old Danish man came for a three-week stay at Humlegaarden from May until June 1998 with the following case-story:

Two enlarged lymph glands on each side of the neck appeared in follicular lymphoma of mixed type, and in November 1997 bone-marrow affection was found.

The patient was in stadium IV. Leukeran tablets were given in a dose of 5 mg daily from the 21st November and this was continued intermittently until the 31st July, 1998.

During the stay at Humlegaarden the patient started treatment with the mistletoe preparation Iscador PchHg in increasing doses together with our standard-treatment of non-Hodgkin lymphomas with Colchium, Capsicum annum, Astragalus and Cetraria as injections as well as the relevant vitamins and minerals for cancer.

A bone-marrow biopsy on 1st September 1998 showed no abnormalities. Seven years have now passed since the start of our treatment of this advanced cancer. The patient is in a fine general condition and has been working full-time in this period.

No chemotherapy has been given since July 1998, and we saw him for control on the 19th March 2005 at Humlegaarden in his usual fine condition.
