Ovarian Cancer

The patient is a 70 year old woman, who had her first stay in Humlegaarden from the 3rd-17th February, 2000. She was operated for ovarian cancer the 18th November 1999 with removal of uterus, both ovaries and the omentum, where metastasis was found. Multiple metastases were also found in the liver, and the biggest metastasis had a diameter of 6 cm. Diagnosis was a serous cystadenocarcinoma.

After the operation she was treated 3 times with carboplatin/taxol, the last time a few days before her arrival in HG. During her stay we started treatment with our mistletoe preparation Helixor M and our standard programme for liver metastases, including local hyperthermia etc. After her return to Norway she continued the chemotherapy together with our therapy, and the liver metastases regress and disappear altogether. The patient is very fine for 2 years, but in August 2002 liver metastases are found again, and she starts chemotherapy again the 29th November. She comes on a new visit to Humlegaarden from 21st December -4th January 2003. She starts again upon her mistletoe treatment, which she stopped July 2000. She was again in a fine form during her stay with normal liver blood- tests.

It is important to emphasize that a continuous immunotherapy with e.g. – mistletoe-injections is of vital importance, also when the tumors have disappeared. Otherwise the cancer in many cases tend to recur.
