Ovarian Cancer with liver metastases

The patient, a 70 year old woman, had her first stay in Humlegaarden from the 3rd-17th February, 2000. On the 18th November 1999 her metastasized uterus, both ovaries and the omentum were surgically removed. Multiple metastases were also found in the liver, the largest of which had a diameter of 6 cm. Diagnosis was a serous cystadenocarcinoma.

After the operation she was treated three times with carboplatin/taxol, the last time a few days before her arrival in HG. During her stay we started treatment with our mistletoe preparation Helixor M and our standard programme for liver metastases, including local hyperthermia, etc. After her return to Norway she continued the chemotherapy together with our therapy and the liver metastases regressed and disappeared altogether. The patient has been very well for two years, but in August 2002 liver metastases are found again and she re-started chemotherapy on the 29th November. She visited Humlegaarden again from 21st December -4th January 2003. She restarted mistletoe treatment, which she had stopped in July 2000. She was again in fine form during her stay with normal liver blood tests.

It is important to emphasize the vital importance of a continuous immunotherapy with mistletoe-injections, even after the tumours have disappeared. Otherwise quite often the cancer tends to recur.
