



## Prostate Cancer

### **PSA less than 0,5 for 4 years without surgery, local radiation or castration**

A Norwegian male, born 1929, with increasing PSA from 12 in 2001 to 25 in 2003 was diagnosed with prostate cancer in November 2004. The biopsy showed adenocarcinoma with a Gleason score of 7. PSA was 40.

The patient was treated with 150 mg Casodex (bicalutamide) daily and given one radiation on both breast regions to prevent side effects. The Casodex treatment was stopped in April 2005 because of pain behind the sternum (the breastbone). PSA was 4. Some months later the PSA was 20, and the patient again was treated with 150 mg Casodex daily, and this treatment has been continued until now. He came to stay at Humlegaarden January/February 2006, and we started treatment with the mistletoe compound Helixor A 50 mg 3 times per week, and he has continued this treatment until now. We also treated with the alpha-reductase inhibitor Avodart 0,5 mg daily, which he was taking for some time after his return to Norway. Also Curbicin and Curcumin was given.

Since the stay here, the PSA has been in the area of 0,3 to 0,5 in these 4 years, and he was very fine at our latest contact with him on the 15th February 2010. PSA was 0,5.
