Start Spreading the News

This is the first line in Frank Sinatra's famous song about New York. The song was sung on a cosy evening at Humlegaarden in December 2002 by a 75-year old man from New York of Italian descent, who looked very much like Frank Sinatra.

He started to feel sick in August 2002, and in September a stadium IV pancreatic cancer was found. It infiltrated on the posterior side of the pancreas around the big blood vessels and therefore he could not be operated. The patient did not want chemotherapy and he went on a juice fast from the 10th October. He stopped it on the 9th November because he was feeling weak. He arrived at Humlegaarden on the 3rd December, and the tumormarker CA-19-9 was 15.300 on the 5th December (the norm range is less than 37), so it was obviously quite high.

We started our therapies with injections of Helixor A and with local and whole body hyperthermia. He felt well during the stay and as planned he went to Ireland on the 15th December, where he got CLT-treatment (Cyto-Luminiscent Therapy).

At our last contact with him on the 8th February, 2003, he was very fine, and the tumormarker CA-19-9 had already gone down to 2031 by the 29th January. This is a remarkable reduction in such a short time.

We should also mention that within the last 10 years the patient has also been treated for bladder cancer and prostate cancer and has a type-2 diabetes.
